

## GRADE 2 Escape Room Facilitator Guide

Direction Lock	The characters each have a thumb pointing up or down depending if they choose to share their work or not. Three want to share and two do not. Order is based on the height of the characters from shortest to tallest.
	Solution: down up down up up
	SUMMARY STATEMENT: "Remember, each creator gets to decide if they want to show their creation to others, or not. It's the creator's decision."
Number Lock	This clue connects back to the video, and there is a link next to it to review it again. The envelopes save, sell, and friends each have a colored border. Students will count the number of pictures with the same border color to go into each envelope. The answers should be put in rainbow order by the color of the envelope/picture borders.
	Solution: 251
	SUMMARY STATEMENT: "Remember, the creator of all these photographs gets to decide which ones to save privately, which ones to show to friends, and which ones to try to sell for money."
Letter Lock	Read the paragraph at the top. Some pictures have names and others don't. Take the names in the narrative in order. Only use the names of those students who put their name on their paper. The first letter of each <b>name</b> (Nick, Antonio, Maria, Eve) is the solution.
	Solution: NAME
	SUMMARY STATEMENT: "Remember, everyone should write their names on their papers so we can see who did the great work!"
Color Lock	Students identify the colors from the border of each clock. They get the correct order by looking at the time on the clocks.
	Solution: red blue yellow green orange
