Direction Lock	<p>Read the narrative next to the video. Direction words appear in order. (...Claire has written. Right away, Amelia...)</p> <p>Solution: right up up right down</p>
Shape Lock	<p>Navigate the maze of copyright. Follow the path in which all of the activities are allowed.</p> <p>Solution: circle star square triangle</p> <p>SUMMARY STATEMENT: <i>“Remember, you’re free to share your own work however you like. But respecting other people’s creative work means respecting their choices.”</i></p>
Word Lock	<p>Assemble the puzzle. Students should read the prompt and understand that this is an example of fair use.</p> <p>Solution: fair use</p>
Color Lock	<p>The clue shows images from the lesson and an example of fair use in which an original painting was parodied by others. The colors are obvious and the order is determined by the copyright dates in the narratives below each picture.</p> <p>Solution: blue green red</p> <p>SUMMARY STATEMENT: <i>“Remember, the images with the muppets and lego are copying many elements of the original painting—but that copying is OK because these are parodies, which generally count as fair use.”</i></p>
