

Middle School Lesson 2 Escape Room Facilitator Guide



Note: This resource could be a teacher-led full class activity in which the teacher enters the answers on the embedded form. Alternatively, it could be assigned to students to work individually or in small groups. *Lock solutions are case sensitive and correct spacing matters.* Once you have all your answers, submit the Google Form. If the form accepts your answers, your answers are correct, and you've escaped!

Number Lock (4 digit)	While reviewing the list of resources, students should see clues as to which deals are legitimate and which are potentially scams or violate copyright. As students are evaluating each example, they may click on the link to confirm their answer. If they click on the item they will be either a) directed to a legitimate website, or b) directed to a warning which describes why the link is of concern. Items 2, 5, 7 and 8 on the list are all problematic. Solution: 2578
Word Lock	After solving the puzzle, students will notice "all four factors" in red to consider when determining fair use. They will also notice some individual letters in the four factors are bold. If they unscramble the bold letters they will get to the solution.
	Solution: fair use
Color Lock	Students must match the definitions with the appropriate terms. The definitions will provide you with the colors needed for the lock. The order of the colors is determined by putting the terms in alphabetical order.
	Solution: yellow purple green orange red blue
Number Lock (4 digit)	Looking at the dates on the book covers and movie posters, students need to determine which ones would be in the public domain. For the solution, the student will need to add the two items found in the public domain (1927 and 1919).
	Solution: 3846
