Escape Room Facilitator Guide

<i>Note:</i> This resource is designed to be a teacher-led, full class activity. The teacher should enter the answers in the embedded form to ensure accuracy. Lock solutions are case sensitive and correct spacing matters. Once you have all your answers, submit the Google Form. If the form accepts your answers, your answers are correct, and you've escaped!	
Word Lock	Solve the rebus puzzle (cat minus -at is c, ear minus -ea is r, egg minus -gg is e, etc.) Solution: creativity SUMMARY STATEMENT: <i>"Remember, this is the overall goal of copyright—to encourage more creativity!"</i>
Word Lock	Students will likely need to review the video or even search for the Creative Commons symbols and their meanings. Match the descriptions to the appropriate symbols. The colors going across the top and bottom give the order from left to right. First, match the red symbol to its associated description regarding Public Domain, the last one. Students should notice that the "F" is in italics. That is the first letter. The yellow symbol goes with ". . ." to carry the same license for sharing . . ." There is an "a" and an "i" that are in italics. Those are the next two letters. Continue through all of the symbols. Solution: fair use SUMMARY STATEMENT: <i>"There are several different Creative Commons licenses—make sure you check what's required when you use a Creative Commons work."</i>
Number Lock	Students should note that "copyright," "public domain," and "whole collection," are in bold letters. There are 6 books shown that are protected by copyright. There are 5 books that are in the public domain. And the whole collection has 11 books. Solution: 6511
Color Lock	Navigate the copyright maze. Only follow the path in which all activities are allowed. Solution: blue red yellow orange
